

Master of Science in Allied Health Admission Requirements

Applicants to the Master of Science in Allied Health (MSAH) program at Oregon Tech should meet the following admission requirements:

- o Hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution
- o Hold a professional license in an allied health discipline
- o Be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended
- o Have attained a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for the last 90 quarter (60 semester) units attempted and for the last 45 quarter (30 semester) units in the major

How to apply:

- o Determine your eligibility for the MSAH program by completing an Eligibility Verification
- o Submit your application and \$50 non-refundable application fee at www.oit.edu/apply
- o Submit a current background check (the link is in the Eligibility Verification)
- Request official transcripts from all regionally accredited colleges and universities attended
- Submit a personal statement that addresses your career goals and relevance to the program, evidence of aptitude for graduate work and evidence of potential for success in the field
- o Submit three letters of reference that address your academic preparation and professional abilities
 - o These must be sent directly from the author. Letters provided by the applicant are not accepted.
- Submit one of these:
 - Official GRE General Test results showing a score of 300
 - Official MAT results showing a score of 400
 - Proctored Essay

Oregon Tech may grant conditional admission to candidates not meeting all of the minimum requirements. Your application will not be considered for admission until all required items are received. Applicants with prior graduate degrees should not submit the GRE, MAT or Essay.
