

[Total acreage – 190.6]





## 6.5 OIT – PORTLAND OPERATIONS

Both the Portland East and Portland West campuses are conveniently located. The Portland East location is just off Highway 205 near the Clackamas Town Center. The Portland West facility is located off Cornell Road, facing AmberGlen Parkway in Beaverton.

After years of sharing space with other educational divisions of the Oregon University System at the CAPITAL Center, OIT's Portland West campus has taken residence in its own facility. Now housed in the AmberGlen building complex in Beaverton, OIT Portland West is poised to have greater outreach and recognition in the West Portland metropolitan area.

OIT also offers degree completion programs in Clinical Laboratory Science (B.S.), on the Oregon Health & Science University campus in Portland; in Paramedic Education (A.A.S.), at the Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue facility in Sherwood; and in Renewable Energy Systems at Clackamas Community College's Wilsonville Training Center.
