

STUDENT AWARDS

MOST DEDICATED STUDENT AWARD

The *Most Dedicated Student Award* was established in 1967 by Jessee Barker who is a graduate of Oregon Tech. He wanted to honor one undergraduate student each year who was involved in campus activities and helped make a difference on campus for the students.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- 1. Enrolled as a bachelor's degree-seeking student, and at least a junior class standing, during the current academic vear
- 2. Nominee should be outstanding in their involvement in specific and general activities of both the campus and the community
- 3. The written nomination should provide a brief description of the student's involvement in each of these areas:
- 4. 50% Student Involvement (i.e. student government, leadership positions, campus activities, organizations or clubs)
- 5. 50% Oregon Tech Community Service
- 6. Student will submit a Student Biography, located at: www.oit.edu/studentawards

The **Most Dedicated Student Award** consists of an engraved permanent plaque housed on the Klamath Falls campus in the Student Affairs Office in the College Union. The recipient is given an engraved clock and plaque and certificate to keep.

NOTE: Per Jessee Barker and family this award is limited to one student.

SUBMISSION:

Letter of Nomination deadline:

5:00 pm on April 11, 2018 to Student Affairs: CU 217 (Klamath Falls) or rachel.winters@oit.edu

Indicate the student's name and for which student award you are nominating the person. Clearly state how the student meets the student award criteria and why you are nominating the person for this award. Nomination is only considered for that specific award and not for others; however, you may nominate a student for more than one award with a separate nomination letter. Include a paragraph or sentence explaining how you know the person you are writing about and the nature of your relationship with them. Also include an evaluation of the student's skills and accomplishments.

Recommendation Letter(s) & Student Biography deadline:

5:00 pm on April 26, 2018 to Student Affairs: CU 217 (Klamath Falls) or rachel.winters@oit.edu

It is highly encouraged by the Student Awards Commission that the student seek at least one recommendation letter (no more than 5) from a student, staff, faculty, friend or community member. The letter should express their support for the student award nomination with a few points from the award criteria.
