

ATHLETIC ACHIEVEMENTS (Table 2.3.3) 2001-02

The Oregon Institute of Technology completed another fine year in athletics. The basketball squad enjoyed another 20+ win campaign with a 22-11 record. LaMont Swinson was All-Cascade Conference and Alassane Bakayoko was the newcomer of the year.

The Oregon Tech softball team won their sixth Cascade Conference title within the past eight years. Leah Azevedo was named Region I Payer of the Year. She was joined on the squad by Leslie Ernstrom, Meagan Webber and Lindy Schneider. The ladies finished second in Region play. Webber, Azevedo and Ernstrom were Scholastic All-Americans for the second straight year. The 40-11 mark is the second best at OIT.

The volleyball squad made the conference playoffs again and Nohealani Hirahara made 1st Team All-Conference. Bree Pollard was named to the NAIA Scholastic All-American Team.

Women's soccer, in only their second year of competition went 8-9-1. Stacy Lambert was named to the All-Conference Squad.

Sophomore Perry Custance finished the season as a member of the All-Conference Team in cross-country. He placed third in the conference meet.

The baseball team in its first season (since 1991) was very competitive. Kellen Stevens made All-Conference and Cory Sedlacek was an Academic All-American.

Track and Field had a good year, finishing second in both men & women's conference meets. Individually, Stacy Lambert was an Academic All-American while Macy Campbell (hurdles), Kasey Jones (heptathlon & javelin), Heather Radke (triple & high jump) and Bryan Quinn (decathlon) all finished first at the conference meet in their respective events.
